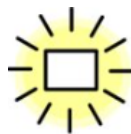

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What has each class been learning about this week?

EYFS- This week in English, we have been reading 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. We have been writing shopping lists in case the tiger should come to Westwood Academy and thinking about the foods he might eat. In Maths, Nursery have been making repeated patterns and Reception have been exploring and naming 3D shapes.

Year 1 - This week in English, we have been writing our own poem based on the book Pussy Cat, Pussy Cat, where have you been? In Maths we have been practicing finding a part and subtraction within 10.

Year 2- This week, Year 2 have been writing character descriptions of 'The Tiger Child!' They have used lots of ambitious words in their writing! In Maths, we have been making amounts of money using a variety of coins.

Year 3- This week in English, we have become time travelers and visited The City of Pompeii. We imagined what it would be like to experience the eruption and wrote a text message to tell our friends and family what we saw and felt. In maths, we have begun to multiply 2-digit numbers by a one digit number.

Year 4 - This week in English, we have been reading The Vanishing Rainforest. We have identified key vocabulary and looked at direct speech. In Maths, we have been continuing to work on our multiplication skills.

Year 5- This week in English, we have been reading a poem called By The River. In class, we performed the poem using actions and different pitches in our voices. In Maths, we have been learning how to multiply numbers using the area model and the column method.

Year 6- This week in English, we have been enjoying our new topic - Argentina. We have started this topic by writing a persuasive piece of writing all about why we need to save the rainforest. In Maths, we have excelled in our lessons focusing on ratio and proportion.

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
