During this half term the children will learn and follow the rules which are expected within every PSHE lesson.

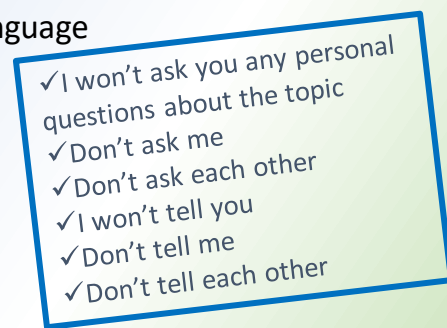
Every lesson will have consistent ground rules in place which:

- ensures the right to pass (as long as actively listening)

Trusted Adults

A trusted adult will be someone who your child feels comfortable to turn to for help. (family members, teachers and doctors)

Teachers will explore this concept with your child. Your child should be comfortable and capable of identifying who their trusted adults could be both within their families and wider circles.

You can use these next few weeks to discuss this with your child at home so you are all clear on who their trusted adults at school and at home are.
