What has each class been learning about this week?

EYFS- This week we have been reading *Maisy* made a gingerbread man in Nursery and *The gingerbread man* in Reception, all of the children made delicious gingerbread men. In Maths, we have been matching numbers to quantities.

Year 1- This week we have been writing a letter to Nancy's Grandma about her trip to London. In Maths we have been adding along a number line and working on our number bonds to 20.

Year 2- This week, in English, we have written the story, 'The Egg Drop!' We have used commas in a list to describe how the chicken tried to save the egg. In Maths, we have been dividing by sharing and grouping. Knowing our times tables has really helped us! In History, we have been exploring inventors and inventions! Next week, we will become inventors creating our very own crisps!

Year 3- This week in English, we have written an alternate ending for our story 'The Wild Girl', adding in our own character into the story. In maths, we have been learning how to divide 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers. In topic, we have been learning about the changes in how people lived across the Stone age, Bronze age and Iron age.

Year 4- This week Year 4 have retold the story of Romulus and Remus. In Maths we have been continuing to multiply and divide. We started out new History Topic on Rotten Romans too!

Year 5- This week in English, we became reporters and wrote newspaper reports about Ernest Shackleton's journey to the South Pole. In Maths, we have been learning about unit fractions, non-unit fractions and equivalent fractions.

Year 6- This week in English, we have been putting all our energy into writing the best descriptive narrative we possibly can. This has involved researching vocabulary, being inspired by pictures and learning different grammatical features. In maths we have been learning to convert between fractions, decimals and percentages.
