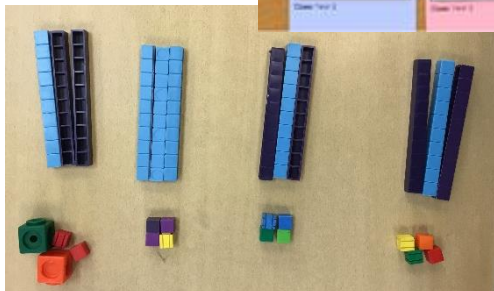


## Our Remote Stars of the Week



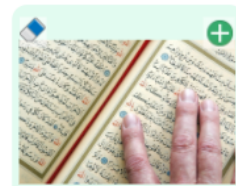
Year group	Stars of the week	Reason for the award

## Remote Learning at Westwood this week ...



### Early Islamic Civilisation - School

Richer boys were educated by a private tutor in the home of the tutor. Most boys however went to school at the mosque. It was normal for the teacher to sit on a mat facing Mecca and the children sat on the floor opposite him in a curved line.



Subjects  
Boys learnt to read by memorising verses from the Quran. They also learnt basic maths. When they left school, some children went to higher education where they learnt law, geography and astronomy.

Girls  
During the early Islamic civilisation, boys received a better education than girls. This was because society believed that the role of girls was to stay at home and look after the house and therefore a good education necessary.
