**Stay safe online**

Remember the 5 SMART rules when using the internet and mobile phones.

- S** **SPOTS**: Keep safe by being careful not to give out personal information - such as your full name, email address, phone number, home address, photos or school name - to people you are chatting with online.
- M** **MEET**: Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Only do so with your parents' or carers' permission and only when they can be present.
- A** **ACCEPTING**: Accepting emails, text messages, or opening files, photos or links from people you don't know or trust can lead to problems - they may contain viruses or nasty messages!
- R** **RELIABLE**: Information you find on the internet may not be true, or someone online may be lying about who they are. Make sure you check information before you believe it.
- T** **TALK**: Tell your parent, carer or a trusted adult if someone or something online you feel uncomfortable or worried, or if you or someone you know is being bullied online.

If you are worried about anything online like if anyone has said something about you, then you should tell a grown up about it. If you see something online that makes you sad, it is important that you share it with an adult that you can trust.

**Stay safe online**

If you stay safe online, then you will not be in danger. Always look out for excitement, strangers and anything that is not appropriate.

- Do not speak to strangers, or meet anybody outside!
- Be careful when you are browsing, always make sure that it is reliable.
- Do not give passwords or personal information to anyone.
- Do not scare or bully each other.
- Do not accept friend requests from strangers.

## Our Remote Stars of the Term



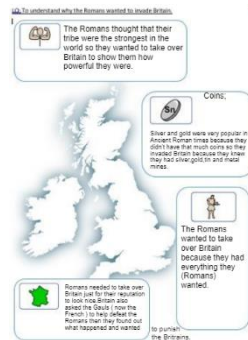
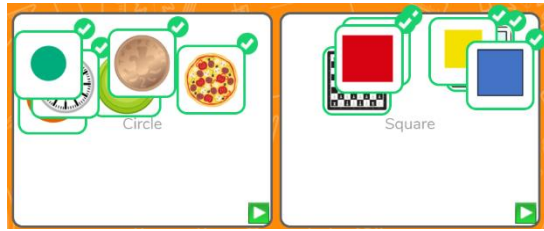
Year group	Stars of the week	Reason for the award

### Tundra Adaptation

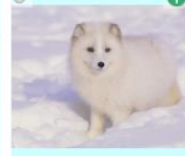


Some animals have predators like hares so they need to camouflage into the snow. Luckily they are white and the colour white to blends into the snow.
